15 shifts at BM-01/SNBL for our home build *in situ* cell for hydrothermal syntheses were successfully finished.




Figure 1: Contour plot showing the formation of YMnO₃. First Y(OH)₃ appears as Y_2O_3 disappears, then the YMnO₃ appears together with small amounts of secondary phases.

The formation of hexagonal YMnO₃ under hydrothermal conditions was followed using *in situ* X-ray diffraction at temperatures ranging from 240 °C to 350 °C. The effects of different precursors, mineralizer concentrations, reducing conditions using Mn₃O₄, yttrium: manganese precursor ratios and citric acid stabilizer were studied. These experiments resulted in hexagonal YMnO₃ in the majority phase (~90%) with varying amounts of secondary phases, dependent on reaction conditions; YMn₂O₅, orthorhombic perovskite YMnO₃. The reaction mechanism was studied revealing the formation of hydroxide intermediate phase (Figure 1).

The formation of $Sr_xBa_{1-x}Nb_2O_6$ (SBN) under hydrothermal conditions was followed by *in situ* X-ray diffraction, studying the effects of niobium off-stoichiometry, strontium: barium ratios (0.2:0.8 – 0.6:0.4), and temperature. Temperature studies were performed to study the kinetics of the formation of the SBN.
